




SUBSCRIPTION MODEL INVESTMENT CYCLE

Introduction to the Open Access Article Publication Subvention Fund (OAAPSF)

Atkins Library at UNC Charlotte regards open access (OA) publication of scholarly articles as a foundational aspect of a sustainable scholarly communication system. To this end, the Library has established a fund intended to cover or contribute to the cost of article processing charges (APCs). This fund will complement other Library expenditures that support OA publication, such as memberships and subscription charges.

The fund emerged from UNC Charlotte's commitment to the principles of the "Compact for Open-Access Publishing Equity" (COPE) http://www.oacompact.org/, launched in September 2009 to help level the playing field between subscription-based and open-access journals. Though not a signatory of COPE, UNC Charlotte has established open access funds compatible with its underlying principles.

Frequently Asked Questions About the Open Access Article Publication Subvention Fund (OAAPSF)

What is the OAAPSF for? What publications are eligible? What publications are not eligible? Are there limits on support? How does the funding work? Where can I get more information about the OAAPSF? Where can I get more information about Open Access at UNC Charlotte? How do I apply?

What is the OAAPSF for?

The fund is intended as a last resort for payment of APCs resulting from OA articles authored by UNC Charlotte faculty, research scientists, postdocs, and students. The fund is restricted to articles accepted for publication in peer-reviewed, OA journals. We ask that funded articles be placed in the Library's repository.

What publications are eligible?

Characteristics of eligible OA journals:

- Peer reviewed
- · Indexed by the Institute for Scientific Information (ISI), or published by a reputable OA publisher, such as Frontiers, Hindawi, PLoS, [etc]
- Have policies and practices consistent with the Open Access Scholarly Publishers Association Code of Conduct (http://oaspa.org/membership/code-of-conduct/)
- · Make their standard fee schedules publicly accessible
- Waive their fees in cases of financial hardship

What publications are not eligible?

- Articles that appear in Beall's List, http://scholariyoa.com/publishers/. Beall's List consists of "potential, possible, or probable predatory scholarly open-access publishers."
- Articles in journals that charge an annual subscription fee, including journals that use a delayed OA model, or offer an "open choice" option to make a particular article open access are not eligible.
- Articles reporting on research supported by funders that allow research funds to be used for publication fees (e.g. NIH) are not eligible for this funding, whether or not
